Form 6 Subject Project Deadlines and Coursework Updates

DCG : Project Deadline January 15th, 2021

Students will study One option instead of two. The DCG project has also been scaled back with fewer outputs required.

Home Economics: Coursework Deadline November 2nd

Course work was completed under teacher supervision pre-lockdown in Form 5.

Gaeilge: Oral - Students must study 10 picture sequences instead of 20. All other elements remain the same.

Written Paper Higher Level - Students will have a choice on prose and poetry section. Students will answer one question out of two on each.

Written Paper Ordinary Level - Students will have a choice on literature section- answer two poetry out of three in both prose and poetry.

Religion- Project work- 1st draft due October 24th. 2nd draft due December 15th

Final completed project due Mid -April 2021.

Geography- Geographical Investigation Deadline (20% of overall grade) 16th April, 2021.

The course has changed in the following way. There are 5 sections to the written exam. The first section is compulsory. In 2021 instead of students having to answer all 4 remaining sections, they answer 3 from 3 different sections and then one from a section of their choice. So effectively they can leave out an entire section. We will of course cover all sections, it will be up to the students what they choose to do.

Agricultural Science - Deadline Individual Investigative Study 16th April, 2021.

Individual Investigative Study (IIS):

Total marks: 100

There have been adjustments to the project and students have been given a presentation on them. Mr Whelan has created a KH Leaving Certificate Ag Science website for Form 5 and Form 6 classes. All of the information, including the presentation is available on website.

This is a brand new course and the Form 6 students will be the first year to be examined.

Adjustments to the course:

Section A - an increase in choice with 12 questions provided and 10 to be answered. In addition, there will be some internal choice through internal optionality in four questions.
Section B - there will be an increased choice with six questions provided to answer four questions, with internal optionality in two questions.
